# November 1st is "Classics Day" This Month is a Classic Book Special!

November 1<sup>st</sup> was declared as "Classics Day" in Japan in 2012, based on the November 1<sup>st</sup> 1008 diary entry of The Diary of Lady Murasaki Shikibu (Murasaki Shikibu Nikki), which revealed the oldest known record of Japan's first classic story "Genji Monogatari". Here "classics" refer to any production of cultural significance, especially in the fields of culture, art, scholarship and thought.

At Hiroshima university we preserve not only Japanese classics, but also many so-called "World Classics". For this issue we will introduce a World Classic: "The Botanical Magazine" and some other books related to botany. You can also view many works on various websites for free, so please think deeply on our predecessors as you browse different classics.

## The Botanical Magazine J or, Flower-Garden Displayed

In 1787, London, a botanist and entomologist named William Curtis (1746~1799) began publishing this magazine about foreign house plants. This magazine is the oldest known botanical magazine with such beautifully painted illustrations, and Central Library has preserved original issues dating back to 1848 in its valuable materials collection. Even now, long after Curtis's death, and after undergoing some restructuring, the magazine is still being published.

During the Age of Discovery in Europe, many people from Europe called "Plant Hunters" explored the world to find undiscovered plants, collect them, and bring them back home. The first public Plant Hunter, Francis Masson (1741~1805) was dispatched from the Royal Kew botanical gardens. In his time, he achieved many things, but faced many hardships during his overseas travels, including being captured by foreign armies and attacked by pirates. It is said that at the end of his journeys he died of sickness or froze to death.

The path of a Plant Hunter was arduous and through their hardship, many of the plants featured in this magazine were brought from overseas back to Europe.

## Strelitzia reginae (Bird of Paradise)

This is one of the flowers Masson found in South Africa and sent back to Europe. When this flower was first introduced to England, it was a sensation in high society! From the fact that its scientific name is King George the Third's queen's maiden-name, it is clear that this plant was very much the talk of the town at the time.
